9.30 - 10.15 Paper-Lite: A Case-Study of a Summer School Syllabus Diana Bauducco, IH London



This session presents a case study of IH London Young Learners Centres' initiative to develop and implement a paper-light syllabus for English Language lessons. We explore the challenges faced, solutions adopted, and the impact on teaching and learning. A whistlestop tour of a variety of practical, easily implementable writing activities for young learners between the ages of 5-10. A brief overview of the theory behind them but with a focus on giving teachers a range of activities that can be used to increase engagement in writing, from letter to sentence level.

Jack is Assistant Director of Studies at IH Sofia, specialising in the teaching of VYLs and Pre A1 level learners. Using Authentic Video Material with YLs and Teens Glenn Standish, IH Toruń



In this practical session, I will show you how to use a variety of authentic video materials in class with a range of students and different CEFR levels. There will be lots of laughs, some singing and above all practical ideas that you can implement into your class next week. Most importantly, the activities will aim to engage and motivate your learners.

Glenn Standish has been teaching English in Poland for over 22 years and has been the Director of Studies of IH Toruń for the past 11 years. He is also an IHCYLT and IHCAM tutor, an IHWO course moderator and has written numerous articles on Teaching English.

Bluey; How the Heelers Can Help Us Maximise Our Potential and That of Our Students Stephen Farren, IH Belfast



Session examines how the *Bluey* aligns with the theme of 'Maximising the Potential of Our YL Centres' by highlighting how imaginative play, storytelling, and creative learning methods can enrich a child's educational experience.

Just as *Bluey* uses playful, engaging narratives to teach valuable life lessons, YL centres can enhance their impact by focusing on interactive, fun, and developmentally appropriate learning methods that nurture children's cognitive, social, and emotional growth.

Stephen has been a member of the IH family since 2010 and is currently the DoS at IH Belfast. Stephen has previously spoken at the YL conference back in 2019. Assisting Discovery (Student-Created Learning Games) Nato Kakhadze, IH Tbilisi



In this session, we will explore strategies to encourage creativity and autonomy in the classroom by providing opportunities for students to design popular activities such as bingo, 'find someone who,' board games, and Taboo cards. By empowering students to create these materials themselves, we aim to foster more creative language use, leading to relevant, authentic, and motivating communication experiences.

Nato has been teaching at IH Tbilisi for 17 years already, since she did her CELTA course in 2007 in the same school. Except teaching she has been coordinating the YL department of the school as well as doing teacher training courses for the past seven years.

Exploring Total Physical Response (TPR) and Guided Discovery (GD) with Unconventional Age Groups Anna Pedzinska, IH San Sebastian



This talk discusses the findings from my own action research into using elements of Guided Discovery (GD) with YLs and Total Physical Response (TPR) with teens. Was GD suitable for YLs? Was TPR too childish for teens? We will look at some of the theory and my own observations as well as activities that participants can use in their classrooms.

She has trained with NILE and IH, ran her own school (2014-2016), and now focuses on preparing teachers to work with young learners. In today's fast-paced, technology-driven world, we face increasing challenges in maintaining student focus and attention. This seminar explores the struggles we encounter in the classroom such as lower achievement in reading tasks; the difficulty in following instructions; worsening social interactions and overall lack of accuracy. Drawing on research, we will examine the factors that are leading to a so called 'attention crisis'. We will then look at how small changes can make a big difference in reclaiming attention in the modern classroom.

Caroline has been teaching anyone who wants to learn English for 32 years. She is passionate about what she does and is an avid lifelong leaner. She lives in Portugal with her family and her dog. She is currently the Director of Studies at IH Torres Vedras and Lisbon.

Is there a place for more playful, joyful learning for students of all ages? And for making more connections with the world around us? In this session, we'll suggest what playful learning could look like with younger and older learners and show how their language learning can be more enriching and meaningful if we integrate EFL with areas like drama, art, music, science, movement, and storytelling.

Fran Seftel is an experienced EFL / CLIL teacher at IH Braga. Her special interest is teaching young learners through a more holistic approach, integrating English in a range of interconnected areas like science, maths, art, music, drama, PE and play. This has been inspired by her coordination of three Erasmus+ projects.

Beverly Whittall has been teaching young learners, teens, and adults in different countries and contexts for over 30 years. She is currently a teacher and Director of Studies at IH Braga, and one of her interests is bringing stories into the classroom. **Teaching the Rainbow** Xana de Nagy, IHWO



What colour do you feel, see and want today? How do our learners see and experience the world and how good are we at teaching the rainbow? In this session, using a story, we will look at the feelings colours invoke and how to help our learners express and understand the colours within them through some practical classroom activities.

There are courses for every stage of a teacher's career, from soon after your initial pre-service qualification, to DELTA level and management courses.


